We are a grass roots, community-based research organisation supported and partly owned by a community-based charitable trust.

We are currently expanding our activities in Palmerston North and other national locations and are looking for several doctors at various levels of experience - registrars, new fellows, and senior practitioners.

Working in a transdisciplinary and multidisciplinary *Teal* work culture, we encourage collegial teamwork at all times which allows continuous and immediate access to other health professional disciplines to support clinical decision making for increasingly complex patients.

The HHPNZ clinical team in-action - telehealth doctors (x 3) that deal with the simple transactional consults, and once the complex patients are stable, passed onto the long-term conditions teams that are comprised of - GPs (x 4), a nurse practitioner, nurse prescriber, clinical pharmacist, physiotherapist, clinical psychologist, social worker and registered nurses (x 8).

All team members have the opportunity to play a role in HHPNZ research projects.

- We are part of an HRC research project looking at community-based transdisciplinary teams and access to non-doctor services to improve health equity.
- We also have Callaghan Innovation Research Grant to develop AI technologies that allow us to move from reactive to proactive health, and to precision delivery of health care, and an understanding of all the drivers of poor health.
